MEET AND CONNECT AT PHIVE

PHIVE at 5 Parramatta Square is officially open. The bold new community, cultural and civic hub with its vibrant red and orange tessellated roof — provides world-class facilities for those who live, work, study or play in Parramatta.

The \$136 million architectural icon spreads across six levels and accommodates a range of flexible event and meeting spaces; all available for community and business use. PHIVE is home to a state-of-the-art library, maker spaces, tech labs and sound studios where anyone can learn, innovate, and create.

Visitor and Council services and the new Council Chambers are also located within this remarkable new building. PHIVE is accessible to everyone, keeping inclusivity and sustainability at its core.

City of Parramatta Lord Mayor Cr Donna Davis said PHIVE is the brilliant, bold centrepiece of Parramatta Square's \$2.7 billion transformation; a place to discover and explore.

"We are proud PHIVE has arrived — a landmark addition to our City. Parramatta's dazzling new building has been years in the making, and we are so delighted PHIVE is now open for everyone to enjoy. "This space has been designed with and for our communities — to connect, collaborate, and enjoy. PHIVE is a much-needed community facility that will service the needs of the region's rapidly-growing population. It's important we have accessible, state-ofthe-art facilities to support the people who live, work, study or visit Parramatta," Cr Davis said.

PHIVE was designed by an architectural team led by award-winning architect Manuelle Gautrand. Ms Gautrand's French firm worked in partnership with Australian firms Lacoste+Stevenson and DesignInc. A local firm, Built, were in charge of construction.

The building was designed to incorporate the original heritage-listed Parramatta Town Hall, giving the old building a new lease of life. As part of PHIVE's 'smart' design, the building has been fitted with giant automated louvres that respond to weather conditions and allow fresh air to circulate.



PHIVE is embedded with culturally-diverse stories, heritage, art and history – it's a space that's sure to inspire.

\$33.16B GRP

As of Quarter 1 2022, GRP was \$33.16b (rolling 4 grt sum), up \$24m from the previous 4 quarter total. (Economy.iD)

207,103 LOCAL JOBS

Local Jobs in Quarter 1 2022 were estimated at 207,103. This has grown by 1,282 (0.6%) from Quarter 4 2021. (Economy.iD)

35.992 BUSINESSES

As of Quarter 1 2022, the total number of businesses was 35,992. This represents 7.2% growth since Quarter 1 last year. (Economy.iD)

242,390 VISITORS

As of Quarter 1 2022, there were 242,390 visitors to the City of Parramatta. This represents 163.5% growth since Quarter 1 last year. Visitation was also at its highest since Quarter 4 2020, showing strong post-COVID visitation recovery. (Economy.iD)

GAME CHANGING COMMERCIAL SPACES

PARRAMATTA SQUARE

Walker's Parramatta Square is one of Australia's largest commercial business precincts. This is a premium commercial space with award-winning architecture and projected to be home to over 24,000 workers daily.

Located between Darcy Street and Macquarie Street, it comprises four premium A-grade commercial towers with 240,000 square metres of new office and retail space, all set around a new 10,000 square metre public domain.

Since its opening in 2020, Parramatta Square has attracted high-profile corporations to relocate their Sydney CBD offices to the geographical centre of global Sydney — the heart of Parramatta.

The final tower at 8 Parramatta Square has been completed and the world-class commercial precinct will soon house industry leaders Deloitte, KPMG, and ABC. 6&8 Parramatta Square is 55 storeys tall and 230 metres high combined. It is the largest commercial building in Australia and the second tallest office tower in NSW.

PARRAMATTA DEVELOPMENTS

197 CHURCH STREET PARRAMATTA

197 Church Street Parramatta is earmarked to become an exciting high-end shopping and dining precinct with 30,000sqm of commercial space, set to be completed in 2025. Holdmark Property Group has plans to revitalise the intersection of Church and Macquarie Streets.

The development will combine existing architecture with the new, including Parramatta's first luxury hotel, Intercontinental Parramatta. High-end restaurants, entertainment venues, and retail opportunities will make this a sought-after investment. Pedestrian connectivity through Ngara Nura Way will be preserved, while paying homage to the Burramattagal people.





85 MACQUARIE STREET

Parramatta's newest office block is almost complete. The building's 10,000sqm of commercial floor space will be available in 2023. The 11-storey office building has the amenities expected of a large-scale office tower but with a boutique feel. With immediate access to thriving Parramatta Square, this development represents a unique opportunity for retail, as well as financial and legal sectors. The Commonwealth Bank of Australia is planning a return to the Parramatta CBD, already pre-committing to two floors.

41-43 HUNTER STREET

The Royal Parramatta Private Hospital at 41–43 Hunter Street will be the first private hospital to service the second CBD and is due for completion in 2025, pending State Government approval.

The competition-winning design will integrate the existing heritage house at 44 Hunter Street. Plans for 24 storeys and 130 beds will help alleviate the healthcare shortfall in the region. The 1,400 square metre space will incorporate a ground floor café and dining spaces, with views overlooking St John's Anglican Cathedral.
